



"The 'Calamus cluster' of poems first appeared in the 1860 edition of Leaves of Grass. They and their author, Walt Whitman, were pivotal to early homosexual emancipation efforts.

In verse, the Poet connected the calamus plant to intimacy between males: '(O here [at pond-side] I last saw him that tenderly loves me . . . / And this, O this shall henceforth be the token of comrades, this calamus root . . .)."
